

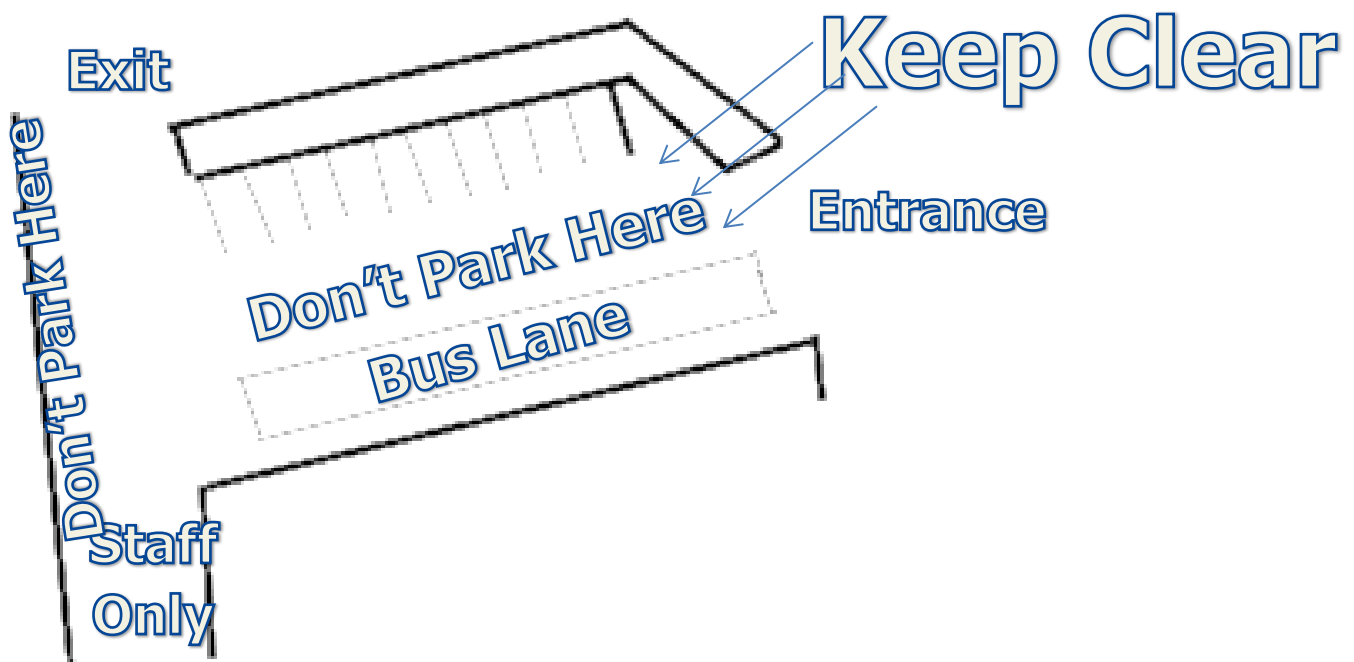
Bryn Offa Newsletter
