Car Park Safety

Those parents who have had children at Bryn Offa for a while will know that the car park is a constant source of concern for me. We do not have the available staffing to put someone on the car park morning and afternoon just to make sure parents do not do anything dangerous. We rely on the fact that everyone who parks there is a parent or grandparent, and as such will put the children's safety above a slightly longer walk. This is still not happening and there are still people parking in the middle of the car park parallel to the bus lane. This area is not for parking but is there to allow a turning circle to get into the car parking spaces. This week a child was nearly run over due to someone reversing out of the entrance when they had parked in the middle. This could easily have been a fatality.

The only option left open to me if parents do not stop parking in the middle will be to reinstate the gate and only allow access to staff and the school transport.

The jumpers we do currently have in lost property (and which are unnamed) will be on display during parents evening if any parents wish to look at it.

Parental contributions to trips

As with all school trips, we rely on the parental contributions to enable the trips to take place. Unfortunately there is often a large cost to school of running a trip, which is why we have to ask parents for contributions when these happen. If contributions are not received, the cost has to be subsidised by school.

Recently we have noticed that some of our school trips and visits have cost the school hundreds of pounds as some parents have not paid any contributions. The school cannot keep funding trips without it affecting other areas of learning. If you are having difficulty with paying for a trip, then please contact the school office confidentially. We can set up small payments on School Money – sometimes even £2 per week can make a huge difference to spreading out the cost. We can also continue to take payments even after a trip has finished so the weekly cost can come down. If you are experiencing genuine hardship then we can work with you to help with the cost of trips and visits. If this is the case then please get in touch. I appreciate that it is difficult when we ask for money, but I hope that we can work together on a solution to make sure that the children get the best experiences possible.
