Bryn Offa Procedures for Snow



As we have had a few threats of snow recently, I thought it would be an appropriate time to remind parents what happens if it snows on a school day. It is important parents follow the guidelines so we can follow all our procedures quickly and safely.

I will only close the school on the grounds of safety, and I give the highest consideration to the safety of the bus transport and the routes they need to take as well as the school car park. As this may need to be based on a forecast rather than the current conditions, it is not possible to guarantee I will always get the decision correct, but I will always make it in the best interests of the children.

Snow before the start of the School Day

If there is a snowfall before school starts, I will make the judgement call on whether to close the school by 8:00am. Once this decision is made the Local Authority is informed, Shropshire Radio is called and if possible a notice is put on the website and a text message will be sent out. If none of these mention a closure, then it can be assumed we are open. Please do not telephone the school to check as it ties up the phone lines.

Snow during the School Day

If we get a higher than forecast snowfall during the day, it is a much more difficult situation to organise. If I have to make a decision to close the school during the day, parents will be immediately informed via the text message service. Once this is done we then contact the bus companies, the Local Authority and Radio Shropshire. If you receive the text message and you are able to come straight in to collect your child, please do so without telephoning the school to avoid tying up the phone lines. The only parents who need to telephone the school are those parents who may not be able to come in immediately themselves and may be sending a relative instead and those whose children travel home by bus. It may be that the buses have to come to school early to collect the children and it is important that we know whether there will be someone to meet them off the bus.
