Head Lice

Please do your part to prevent head lice spreading by checking your child's hair. We would recommend that your child's hair is checked regularly (at least once a week), and on a regular basis thereafter. Please also watch for signs of head lice as they are much easier to treat if caught early. If head lice or eggs are detected, treatment should be given to the whole family **before** your child returns to school. A second treatment should also be given 10 days later.

We would ask that any cases of head lice are reported to the school office to allow us to monitor cases and prevent head lice spreading.
