## **Harvest Service at Llanymynech**

On Monday the children will be attending the Harvest Service at Llanymynech Church. As with previous years, we would like to make donations to the Oswestry food bank. We are currently looking to appoint a lunchtime supervisor. The position will involve working as part of a team to ensure the lunchtime at Bryn Offa is safe and enjoyable. The role will include supporting pupils in lunchtime play activities and basic first aid (all training will be provided).
