Just before Christmas, one of our parents made a really kind offer to support us with the work we do on road safety with the children. Mr Evans (of Evans Aggregates) allowed us to use of his company lorries to help the children to understand the unique dangers posed by large vehicles that naturally have a bigger blind spot than cars. Each of the classes had a wonderful time and learnt a lot. It is always the unusual and interesting lessons that stay with the children for a long time.



In addition to providing the lorry, Mr Evans has exceeded my expectations of generosity by a long way by also providing some high visibility jackets for our bus children and for also arranging for the car park to be remarked.
