Dear Parents and Guardians

During the Covid times we had quite a long period when we weren't able to organise school trips. Now we are back to normal we are in full flow with the range of exciting activities for the children. However, like everything else the costs of visits has increased quite dramatically.

While we continue to provide a rich variety of experiences, we are also working hard to keep the costs to an absolute minimum. We try to make sure the visits are staggered so parents and carers with children in more than one class don't get hit by two visits at the same time and we are also looking at the timing of the Year 5 and 6 residential visits to stagger these a little more as well.

This year we have also ensured children receiving benefits related free school meals do not have to pay for visits. Their places are covered by the funding supplied from the government and so no parent or carer is paying more to subsidise anyone else. Because any shortfalls in the contributions from the other parents and guardians can only come from the school budget, this means we may in the future have to cancel visits if the shortfall places too much of a burden on the budget.

If you are having any difficulty with the voluntary contributions for the visits please do contact us and we can try to help by arranging a payment plan if necessary. If you are entitled to the benefits related free school meals please do sign up for them as even if you only qualify for a short period, the funding stays in place for six years.
