<u>Staff Changes at Bryn Offa</u>

<u>Sun Safety</u>

As the weather has taken a turn for the better, I thought it may be worth reminding parents what the systems for sun safety are.

For sun safety, the three important considerations are to cover up (with a hat for example), to wear sun screen and to drink plenty of water. Lots of children come to

school in baseball caps, but the guidance is always to wear a wide brimmed hat if possible that provides cover for face and neck. Not all sun screens are the same, so parents need to make sure that the sun cream used is one that can be applied before school and does not need to reapplied during the school day and that it also provides a high enough level of protection. Children should always come to school with a full water bottle, which can be refilled during the day. As there is shade on the playground and field, it is very rare for us to keep the children inside when it



is sunny but we have very occasionally done this when the chances of sunburn are very high. Please also remember to avoid sending your child in with sunglasses as these can be a danger on a field where children are playing football.
