

Pant Pandas

Failure to do this may result in the absence being unauthorised.

It is not possible to authorise holidays. If you choose to take your child out of school for a holiday, this will be unauthorised and you could be issued with a fine.

Fducation Welfare Officer Information

In Education Welfare Officer is a dedicated professional who plays a crucial role in promoting regular school attendance. EWOs visit schools to meticulously monitor attendance patterns. Their focus extends beyond mere numbers; they keenly observe signs that may indicate underlying challenges. By collaborating closely with school staff, parents, and students, EWOs provide invaluable support to enhance attendance. It's important to recognize that improved school attendance not only impacts academic outcomes but also contributes significantly to social and emotional well-being.

Lateness

Starting the day with a calm arrival is crucial. Walking into the classroom after others can have negative effects on your child. They might feel nervous, embarrassed, worried, and stressed, impacting their ability to absorb new learning.

A gentle reminder:

The green gate at the side of the school building and the back doors are opened at 8.45am. All children must be supervised by an adult or guardian until this time. In the morning, the children enter the school building via the back door.

The bell for morning registration rings at 9.00am and at this time the back door to the school and the green gate will be closed. Any children arriving after this time will receive an L mark in the register. If your child arrives after 9.10am they will receive a U mark.
